



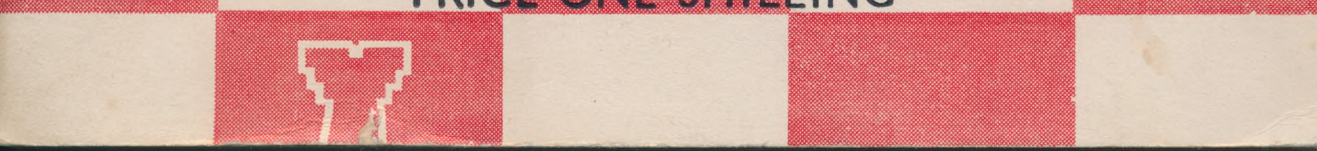

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IMPORTANT NOTICES

OPENING CEREMONY will take place in the Assembly Rooms, on Monday, 10th August, at 2-00 p.m.

PLAY will take place in the Assembly Rooms every day excepting Saturday, 15th August, when the adjoining Exhibition Hall will be used.

CLOSING CEREMONY. Prizes will be distributed in the Main Hall at the closing ceremony on Saturday, 22nd August, at 10-30 a.m., and these will be awarded by the Rt. Hon. The Lady Mayoress of York (Mrs. R. S. Oloman).

RECORDING OF GAMES. Games must be recorded on the official scoresheets which will be provided before each session by the controllers.

COMPLETION OF GAMES. On the completion of a game, the players must replace the pieces.

Note—Tournament Rule No. 16.

“The **Winner** of the game shall deliver to the Controller an intelligible record of the moves made in the game, using a recognised system of notation, and indicating clearly the result of the game, which shall be signed by both players. In the case of a **drawn game**, **both competitors** shall deliver such records, but one such record, so long as it is signed by both, will be accepted. These records must indicate the tournament and the round of which the game is a part. The result of a game shall not be officially recognised until these records have been delivered, unless the Controller agrees to accept other evidence.”

HOURS OF PLAY. The British Championship, The British Ladies' Championship and the Major Open Tournament will be played during the afternoons with a five-hour session from 2 to 7 p.m., except that on the Opening Day play will be from 2-30 to 7-30 pm. Adjourned games will be played from 8-30 to 10-30 p.m. with a second session, where necessary, from 9-30 a.m. to 12-30 p.m. on the following day.

All other Tournaments will be played during the morning with a four-hour session from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., including Monday, 10th August. Adjourned games will be played from 3 to 6 p.m., with a second session where necessary from 8-30 to 10-30 p.m.

REFRESHMENTS. These will be served in the Museum Rooms each day between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. excepting Saturday, 15th August, when they will be available in the Small Annexe.

LOCAL INFORMATION can be obtained from the local stewards or from the Information Bureau, City Public Library.

FIVE MINUTE CHESS is strictly prohibited owing to risk of damage to the clocks, and **ANALYSIS** must take place in the room provided for the purpose —NOT in the main playing area.

B.C.F. CONGRESS, 1960

We are pleased to announce that our 47th Congress will be held in the Sir Percy Gee Building at Leicester University from the 15th to 27th August, 1960, under the auspices of the Leicestershire Chess Club in celebration of that club's centenary. Every effort will be made to provide suitable accommodation, as in addition to the University opening one or more of their Halls of Residence, it is anticipated that arrangements will be made for the provision of suitable hostel accommodation for junior players at a reduced charge. Brochures will be available to all those interested during this Congress and one of the Controllers will make a suitable announcement to this effect and you are, therefore, asked to take this advantage by obtaining a copy whilst you are playing here.

All the usual events will be included. Entries for the British Championship Qualifying Competition are invited and a copy of the entry form will be circulated to all competitors during the course of this Congress. As the Secretary keeps a record of this fact will all intending entrants please assist him in using the form which he receives here and so save both time and postage in the sending out of a second copy. You are reminded that you may complete your form when you receive it, pass this with the entry fee to Mr. Shaw, who will then arrange to forward these through our Treasurer.

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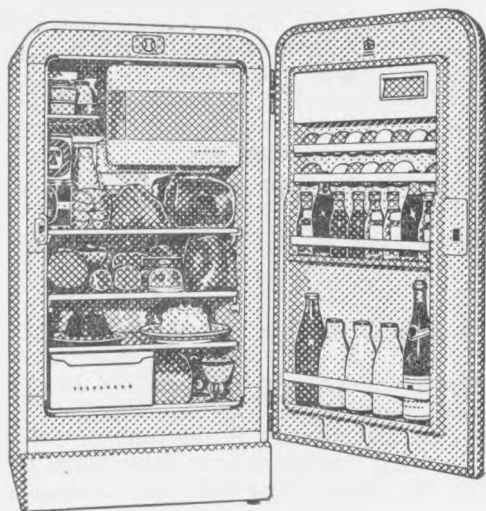
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SWISS TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Eleven rounds shall be played, except in the British Boys' under 18 Championship where fourteen rounds shall be played.
2. A competitor shall play any other competitor once only.
3. Subject to the operation of Rule 2 above, each competitor shall be paired in each round with another competitor, whose score is equal to his or, if that is not possible, with one of those competitors whose scores are most nearly equal to his.
4. In allocating the move, the Committee will endeavour to give each competitor the white men and the black men in alternate games, but the conditions of the competition will not allow this to be guaranteed.
5. For pairing purposes, the Committee may apply the Sonneborne-Berger or other system of scoring to break ties, but such system or systems will not be used for the allocation of prizes.
6. Should a competitor for any reason withdraw from the tournament, his score for the purpose of pairing in subsequent rounds shall be regarded as 0 (nil), and the competitors with whom he is subsequently paired (other than another withdrawn competitor) shall be deemed to have won their games.
7. The Committee reserves the right to postpone the commencement of any round until all the games from previous rounds have been played to a finish.
8. For the purpose of allocating competitors to a score for pairing purposes, unfinished games may be temporarily adjudicated, but all such unfinished games shall be played to a finish during the course of the competition.
9. The Committee reserves the right to adjudicate on any matter arising out of or not covered by the foregoing rules, and to interpret these rules.
10. In the event of any dispute arising from the above, the Committee shall consist of the two Controllers and an additional member. In the absence of any of these three, the two officials present shall co-opt a deputy. The decision of the Committee shall be final.

PROMOTIONS and EXEMPTIONS

CHAMPIONSHIP.

Only four prizewinners shall be exempted to the final in the following year, and in the event of ties these shall be determined by application of the added scores of such players' opponents, the player(s) with the highest score(s) being exempted.

MAJOR OPEN.

The highest eligible placed player will be entitled to compete in the British Championship in 1960. In the event of a tie it shall be determined by application of the added scores of such players' opponents, the player with the highest score being the successful competitor.

FIRST AND SECOND CLASSES.

The winners of the First and Second Class Tournaments will be entitled to compete in the Major Open and First Class respectively in 1960. Ties to be determined as for the Major Open.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS Ten shillings per annum.

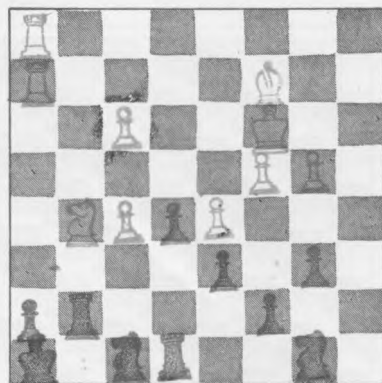
